

«Practise and Procedures of Law» («Practical Master») (48 ECTS)

Description

While the Profile «Practise and Procedures of Law» serves a more exhaustive study of a variety of areas of law, a special emphasis is placed on those subjects that are most important for the practise of law. This Profile continues the general law education, and is intended for all who are planning a career in the practise of law (lawyers, judges, jurists in administration or in business, etc.). This Profile offers the possibility to learn the principles of procedural law (in criminal, private and administration law) and the means of enforcement, as well as gaining knowledge in substantive law (private, public, criminal, and international law). Although this Profile guarantees a general education in law, the possibility exists, due to the wide range of courses offered, to set an emphasis on the student's area of interest. This «General Profile» can also be combined with other subject profiles.
