The Future of Health Law

Some of the most pressing and controversial legal research questions of our times are posed by health-related scientific advances and changing attitudes towards health. Amid disruptive technology and ever-evolving societies, a wide variety of fascinating topics arise with far-reaching consequences on healthcare and human life itself. What role should law play in euthanasia and assisted suicide? At the interface of emerging genetic manipulation, human enhancement and embryonic stem cell research, how to strike a balance between protecting human dignity whilst granting incentives for biomedical research? In regard to end-of-life care, do traditional approaches towards competency, capacity and undue influence seem adequate? Legal and ethical challenges are, furthermore, posed by the scope of privacy rights in electronic health records; telemedicine; informed consent; surrogacy; organ donation and transplantation; and the rationing of medical care. These are, amongst others, a few of the exciting legal challenges that will shape the future of health law.

We welcome submissions in all fields of law from graduate (particularly, Ph.D. level) students. Submissions are not bound by the topic of the conference, but preference will be given to papers that address related issues.
