Guidelines for doctoral studies Department of Economics

Adopted by the Council of the Department of Economics on 04.12.2018

With regard to art. 7 of the "Règlement sur l'octroi du doctorat ès sciences économiques et sociales (Dr.rer.pol.) et du doctorat ès sciences sociales (Dr.rer.soc.) du 22 mars 2005" (state of 26th February 2018) the Council of the Department of Economics decides:

Doctoral candidates are expected to invest in formal education and to develop their research and presentations skills. They are required to collect a minimum of 30 ECTS in the three main categories listed below (Education, Scientific workshops and seminars, Complementary academic qualifications). A minimum of 5 ECTS are compulsory in the category of "Education" and "Scientific workshops and seminars". As a standard, we expect and strongly encourage PhD candidates to collect substantially more than the bare minimum of compulsory credits.

The doctoral studies starts with the admission of the candidate to the program and it should be completed at the latest with the registration for the thesis defense. At the end of the doctoral program, the Department shall attest – based on a detailed summary of the documented achievements – to the Exams' Delegate that the candidate has acquired the minimum of compulsory credits. The final grade is based on the evaluation of the written thesis and the oral defense.

The doctoral candidate and the supervisor are jointly responsible for the collection and documentation of the achievements submitted to the Department Council for evaluation and allocation of credits.
