WHAT New Directions in Experimental Pragmatics

Back in 2004, Ira Noveck and Dan Sperber edited a book that set the research agenda of a new field in the investigation of cognitive processes governing the elaboration of meaning in context: Experimental Pragmatics.

Almost 15 years later, we are pleased to welcome Ira Noveck who will come to Fribourg to take stock of the past and current research in experimental pragmatics. In doing so he will rely on his extensive experience in carrying out and discussing experimental designs to test pragmatic hypotheses.

With him we will explore, through his own research, some of the main insights gained through the application of experimental methodology to the study of human cognitive processes responsible for the construction and comprehension of pragmatic meaning. We will try to evaluate what has/hasn't worked in this scientific paradigm and assess the kind of insights we have gained over the last 15 years.

Also, Ira Noveck will look into the directions that future research in experimental pragmatics will or could take. What are the newly discovered territories: both on a methodological and theoretical level?

The workshop will start with two presentations given by Ira Noveck and will then unfold to two discussion sessions whose goal will be to present and discuss the issues brought forward by the participants based on their own work, as well as other research questions currently faced by scholars in the field.
