The International Research and Consulting Centre of the Institute is active in research, capacity building and consultancy, cooperating with state authorities, universities, and organisations in Switzerland and abroad. Its activities aim at contributing to the peaceful coexistence of people in multicultural societies, to development and good governance.

We, the International Research and Consulting Centre (IRCC), are recruiting a

Senior Researcher (80-100%)

with intended start date **1 July 2023** (or by agreement) for 2 years initially with the possibility of extension depending on funding availability.

The main duties include:

- Independently lead consultancy projects individually or as part of a team.
- Lead training and capacity building activities independently or as part of a team.
- Support the IRCC research agenda in the areas of federalism, decentralization, powersharing, minority rights, democratization, constitution building, etc., particularly (but not exclusively) with a focus on countries in the Global South, through the acquisition of research grants and regular research outputs in peer-reviewed internationally recognised publications.
- Support and further develop IRCC and IFF outreach and communication activities for example through engaging in podcasts, short teaching videos and blog contributions.
- Help consolidate and expand the IRCC network across the globe in order to find partners for different consultancy and research projects.
- Engage and contribute to the in-house activities of the IFF, including in-house colloquia, support for guest researchers and the organisation of regular workshops, conferences and other events.
- Take a leading role in the further development of the IRCC and the IFF as a whole by engaging in regular strategic discussions, the mentoring of junior colleagues and the support for long-term strategic planning, including budget planning.

- PhD in Political Science, Law or a related discipline;
- Extensive experience of academic research demonstrated through peer-reviewed publications in internationally recognised outlets;
- Experience in consultancy and engagement with non-academic audiences, involvement in constitution-building processes and engagements with governments, non-governmental organisations and international institutions;
