ACCOMMODATIONS	
University dormitory	University dormitory is available to exchange students. Some of the residences are located off campus.  https://iss-intl.osaka-u.ac.jp/supportoffice/eng/housing/ Online application system will be introduced once applicants are officially accepted as an exchange student.  The system will start to accept applications from 0:00 (JST) of the 1st day of 3 months before to 14 days before residency on first-come-first-served basis.  For those who will study from spring, 0:00 (JST) of January 1.  For those who will study from fall, 0:00 (JST) of July 1.  *Note: The number of rooms available is limited and the demand for university dormitory often outweighs supply. Applicants should note that placement into university dormitory is not guaranteed. If Osaka University cannot offer a room for exchange students, we will provide the students with other options such as private housing.

VISA	
Visa application	All international students who will stay in Japan more than 90 days are required to obtain Student(留学)visa prior to entry into Japan at the Japanese Embassy/Consulate in their home country. Certificate of Eligibility (CESR) is one of the necessary documents to apply for visa at the Embassy/Consulate. CESR should be applied by host university to the Immigration Bureau. Osaka University will apply to the Osaka Immigration Bureau for exchange students. Detailed information on CESR application will be notified to students after their acceptance at Osaka University is officially decided. ESTIMATED LIVING EXPENSES	
Living expenses	The average monthly expenses (excluding tuition) of international students are approximately 81,000yen(US\$711) in Kinki area, where Osaka is located. Tuition	Exchange students pay tuition to home university even while they study at Osaka University. The tuition for Osaka University is exempted based on student exchange agreement between partner universities.

INSURANCE	
Mandatory insurance that exchange students are required to purchase	National Health Insurance: Covers 70% of medical bills. Insurance premium: 2,000 – 3,000 JPY per month (depends on the city where students live)  Personal Accident Insurance for Students Pursuing Education and Research (PAS) called in Japanese "Gakkensai" Osaka University students are required to purchase PAS. Insurance premium: 1,000 JPY per year.  How to apply for the insurances is informed at mandatory orientation.
Strongly recommended insurance to purchase	Overseas traveller's personal accident insurance and Liability insurance covering the period from your departure until your return home.
