Language Requirement	It is desirable for exchange students to have sufficient English or Japanese language proficiency and submit one of the following certificates issued within 2 years:
	(English) - TOEFL iBT 80 or higher - IELTS 6.0 or higher - TOEIC 750 or higher - Cambridge CAE or CPE with a grade of B2 or better - Official certificate/letter which proves English is the medium of instruction at home university

Misc.	Applicants are supposed to be the student of their home institution during all exchange period* and return to their home institution to graduate after the period. If he/she will graduate from his/her institution during the period, we will NOT be able to accept him/her.  Applicants shall, during the term of exchange, adhere to the rules of Osaka University, in addition to adhering to the rules of the home institution.

Japanese Language Program	Credited course called "JA" is available for exchange students. The course is offered 3 times a week. The number of credits earned per semester is 4.  There are six levels from Elementary (JA100) to Advanced (JA600).	
Length of each class	90 minutes	
Weeks of study per semester	15 weeks except for examination period	
Credit	45 hours of study including 15-30 class hours = 1 credit (approx. 1.8 ECTS)  *Most single-semester courses are worth 2 credits.  1 class = 90 minutes 1 course = 15 weeks

Workload requirements (Minimum credits to be registered)	Exchange students are required to take a minimum workload of 10 hours (600 minutes) per week by the Immigration Control Law in order to be eligible for Student visa.  Since one class basically takes 90 minutes, exchange students should register 7 courses or more per week to fullfill the requirement.	
Maximum credits to be registered	7 courses = approx. 14 credits per semester  No limitation	
Course registration	Exchange students submit a course registration form to Educational Affairs Section for designated period after each semester starts.

How to nominate	Exchange coordinators should send the nomination form with following information by the deadline via email.  1. Nominated student's name  2. His/Her registered program at home university (e.g. Undergraduate/Master)  3. His/Her major and affiliation at home university (e.g. Civil Law, School of Law)  4. Expected graduation/completion date at home university  5. Intended student status at Osaka University (Special Auditor or Special Research Student)  6. Intended period of exchange

How to apply	Please collect all applications from your institution and send application documents below in PDF (no need to post) by the deadline from international office.

VISA	
Visa application	All international students who will stay in Japan more than 90 days are required to obtain Student(留学) visa prior to entry into Japan at the Japanese Embassy/Consulate in their home country.  Certificate of Eligibility (CESR) is one of the necessary documents to apply for visa at the Embassy/Consulate. CESR should be applied by host university to the Immigration Bureau. Osaka University will apply to the Osaka Immigration Bureau for exchange students. Detailed information on CESR application will be notified to students after their acceptance at Osaka University is officially decided. Tuition	Exchange students pay tuition to home university even while they study at Osaka University. The tuition for Osaka University is exempted based on student exchange agreement between partner universities.

INSURANCE	
Mandatory insurance that	National Health Insurance: Covers 70% of medical bills. Insurance premium: 2,000 – 3,000 JPY per month (depends on the city where students live)
exchange students are required to purchase	Personal Accident Insurance for Students Pursuing Education and Research (PAS) called in Japanese "Gakkensai" Osaka University students are required to purchase PAS. Insurance premium: 1,000 JPY per year.  How to apply for the insurances is informed at mandatory orientation.
Strongly recommended insurance to purchase	Overseas traveller's personal accident insurance and Liability insurance covering the period from your departure until your return home.
