Why study W&O Psychology in Fribourg?

Individual tutoring and small groups

In Fribourg, you will study in small groups with direct and privileged contact to supervisors.

Internationality

Master in Psychology, Work and Organisational Psychology

Each of the following modules is comprises 15 ECTS:

Foundations in Psychology

General lectures covering elementary areas in psychology.

Work and Organisational Psychology

General lectures covering the important topics of work and organisational psychology (e.g. Stress at work).

Occupational Health Psychology

Specialised lectures with a focus on how work influences employees' health, well-being and social relationships (e.g. personnel development, organisational justice, work & family).

Human Factors

Specialised lectures with a focus on human-machine interaction (e.g. product usability, web accessibility).

Complementary knowledge from an optional module offered in Fribourg including Development and School Psychology, Clinical Psychology and Cognitive Neurosciences.

Master project and thesis

Students conduct and document their own research study, embedded in ongoing research projects and supervised by members of the two research groups.

Organisational internship

Students gain experience during an internship in the field of work and organisational psychology under guidance and supervision of a psychologist.

The Master program prepares for postgraduate training
