

Read&Publish agreement between Springer Nature and the University of Fribourg

1. Agreement and Conditions

Within the framework of the agreement between Springer Nature and the Consortium of the Swiss University Libraries, researchers at the University of Fribourg can publish in Open Access and free of charge **under the following conditions**:

- The date of **acceptance** of the article is after 01.07.2020.
- The national quota is not reached.
- The main author (**corresponding author**) is **affiliated** with the University of Fribourg at the time of submission, i.e. meets one of the following conditions:¹
 - He or she has an employment contract with the University of Fribourg at the time of submission;
 - He or she has a clinical title attributed by the University of Fribourg according to the Statutes of the University of Fribourg, article 30b ([link](#));
 - He or she is Professor Emeritus of the University of Fribourg.
- The article was submitted to one of the journals ([link](#)) included in the publication part of the agreement. The agreement concerns only hybrid journals and does not cover full Open Access journals published by Springer. However, the University of Fribourg benefits from a 15% account on the APC of these journals (<https://www3.unifr.ch/researcher/en/openscience/open-access/apc-reductions.html>)
- The type of the publication figures on the eligible article type list:
 - OriginalPaper
 - ReviewPaper
 - BriefCommunication
 - ContinuingEducation

2. Process for the Researcher

If the researcher fulfils the above-mentioned conditions, he or she may benefit from the agreement in the following way:

- 1) Once the article has been accepted, the corresponding author receives an e-mail to choose the publication options.
- 2) He/She selects his or her affiliation.
- 3) He/She chooses whether he/she wishes to publish his/her article in Open Access or not. **The University of Fribourg recommends to choose the publication in Open Access.** However, if the author does not meet the conditions described above, he/she will not be able to benefit from the agreement and will receive the invoice for the publication costs himself/herself.
- 4) He/She accepts the conditions of the Open Access licence.

NB: in all contacts with Springer Nature, researchers are advised to **use their institutional email address** (@unifr.ch).
