Unjust Universities? D(iversity) E(quity) I(nclusion) Policies at European Universities

Policies on diversity, equity, and inclusion (DEI) are implemented and enforced to varying degrees in state institutions as well as in the private sector, therefore the project aims to analyze the dynamics of the (de)institutionalization of DEI policies at four public research universities (represented by the researchers) in a comparative design. Higher education research so far has dealt with governance issues and the comparison of individual agendas, as well as rich data material from individual case studies, however, not referring to DEI policies.

DEI policies are often positioned externally as branding without bringing about legal and structural changes to teaching–learning processes, recruitment or university management.

- Which topics, programs, persons, and texts are addressed or implemented at universities in connection with DEI policies?
- What strategic goals are associated with the implementation of DEI policies, and how are they processed and translated within the organizations?
- How is the DEI agenda related to educational and social justice as well as excellence?
- What experiences do actors (students and staff) associate with DEI policies within university?
- Who is able to access universities?

The presentation will give some insights to preliminary work to this project
