Examination Period	Fall Semester: between December and February Spring Semester: between May and July The exam schedule varies across faculties. Therefore, it is the student's responsibility to verify the relevant dates and seek clarification if needed.
Academic Information	
Main Teaching Languages	French and German: almost all the study programmes can be studied in French and German or bilingual. Most English-taught courses are offered at Master's level.
Language Requirements	Exchange students are not required to submit a language certificate when applying to the University of Fribourg. However, they must demonstrate sufficient oral and written proficiency in the language(s) of the courses listed in their Learning Agreement. Please consult the course catalogue to verify the teaching language of each course. A minimum level of B2 (Common European Framework of Reference for Languages) is recommended to ensure the ability to take notes and write academic papers. Students are required to provide proof of a B2 level in the language of instruction when applying for a visa. An official language proficiency certificate (such as TOEFL, IELTS, or Cambridge) must be submitted at this stage. More information: Language Requirements
Pre-Semester - Intensive Language Courses tailored for exchange students The information is available and can be checked when filling in the online application on the INSCRUNI tool.	A French intensive course for different levels including a programme of cultural and sports activities is organised before the semester starts: <ul style="list-style-type: none"> 3 weeks before the fall semester: 24.08 -11.09.2026 (90 hours / 6 credits / CHF 400.-) 2 weeks before the spring semester: 08.02 - 19.02.2027 - (60 hours / 4 credits / CHF 270.-) A German intensive fresh-up course is organized at the same time in collaboration with a local language school. Language Center at the University	During the semester , language courses are offered in French, German, Italian and English at level A1 to C2. They are free of charge for all students. Online registration opens from two weeks before the beginning of the semester. First students have to pass an online placement test and can then register for a course at their level. Grading System	Students are assessed either by oral or written exams, and/or by papers. The credit system is based on the European Credit Transfer System ECTS. One ECTS credit corresponds to a workload of 25 to 30 hours. More information: Credit and Grading System
Credit Load	More than 30 ECTS per semester are not recommended. There is no official minimum of ECTS required by the Unifr, but a reasonable workload of at least 15 ECTS is expected. We expect incoming students to choose most of their courses in the study field of the exchange agreement they were nominated through. Exchange students usually take fewer courses if they study in a foreign language. This has to be discussed prior to departure with the home coordinator. More information: Learning Agreement .
Transcript of Records	Transcripts of records are issued to each student: <ul style="list-style-type: none"> Around end-February for the Fall Semester Around mid-July for the Spring Semester or the Academic Year If a student writes a paper after the examination period, the issue of the Transcript of records will be therefore delayed.

The course programme is updated every June.</p> <p>Students send us:</p> <ol style="list-style-type: none"> 1. The <i>Course List</i> with the application and is based on the course programme of the previous academic year. 2. The <i>Learning Agreement</i> based on the updated course programme until July 31st.
Nomination and Application Procedure	
Nomination Deadline	<p>Deadline for the Fall Semester or Academic Year: March 15 (if possible) Deadline for the Spring Semester: September 15 (if possible)</p> <p><i>Exceptions are possible. Please let us know by email if you intend to nominate your students at a later date.</i></p>
Nomination Procedure	<p>To nominate students, we ask IROs to send an email to international-incoming@unifr.ch including the following details: student's first and last name, gender, nationality, date of birth, email address, field of study, level of study, and intended study period (Fall Semester, Spring Semester, or Academic Year).</p>
Application Deadline	<p>Deadline for the Fall Semester of Academic Year: March 31. Deadline for the Spring Semester: September 30.</p>
Application Procedure	<p>After reception of the nomination, an online application link is sent to the student by email. This is a personal link, which can be used only once.</p> <p>The student has to upload the following documents:</p> <ol style="list-style-type: none"> 1. Application form, signed by the student and her or his home coordinator 2. Course List or Learning Agreement 3. Official Transcript of former records 4. List of courses attended at the time of the application 6. Language Skills (Europass) - this is a self-assessment of language proficiency. 7. Motivation Letter 8. Curriculum Vitae 9. Checklist 10. Copy of the passport <p>At the end of the application procedure, students find the information regarding the application for housing (Apertis residencies) and the pre-semester language intensive course.</p>
Confirmation of placement and deadline	<p>The student will receive an email containing a letter of acceptance as a non-degree-seeking student under the bilateral agreement. This document is essential for the visa application process.</p> <p>For the Fall Semester of Academic Year: is expected early May. For the Spring Semester: is expected early November.</p>

Visa Application

<p>Visa Application Please apply early as procedure can take up to 3 months</p> <p>Information on our website: Practical Information: Visa</p>	<p>According to the procedure, the student applies for the visa at the Swiss Embassy or Consulate in the home country. This request is forwarded to the Cantonal authority in Fribourg for approval and then sent back to the Embassy or Consulate with the Cantonal authority's decision.</p> <p>For the visa application, the student must submit the following documents:</p> <ol style="list-style-type: none">1. The letter of confirmation is attached to the placement confirmation email and is also available on the MyUnifr student online portal.2. A letter in which the student commits himself to leave Switzerland after his/her study period.3. A course list for his/her study period at our university.4. A brief résumé with the schools attended and certificates if any, description of the current studies, the languages learned, and if applies to internships and/or professional engagements, etc. It also must include the objectives of the study period, which is an exchange study period, and that the aim is not to obtain a university degree or university certificate at the end of the exchange study period. The stay is within a degree delivered in the home country.5. Proof of financial resources: CHF 21'900.- for the whole academic year or CHF 10'950.- for a semester. This must be evidenced by a bank statement from either a Swiss bank or a bank in the applicant's home country with a representation in Switzerland. Please consult the list of the officially accredited banks by the FINMA (Swiss Financial Market Supervisory Authority). The bank account must be in the student's name.6. Proof of language proficiency: Students do not need to submit a language certificate when applying to Unifr. But all students are required to demonstrate that they have attained a B2 level in the language of instruction when applying for a visa. At this stage, they must therefore provide an official language proficiency certificate (TOEFL, IELTS or Cambridge). ➔ Be aware that the Swiss diplomatic/consular mission may request further documentation or other guarantees (e.g., a language test at the embassy). <p>Documents submitted with the visa application must be translated into French or German. Documents in English will not be accepted by the Immigration Office of the Canton of Fribourg.</p> <p>For more information, please visit and+ website and Visa</p>
