Description	Around 100 universities in approximately 50 different countries participate in the ISEP Exchange program. As part of this program, students from the University of Freiburg receive a financial aid to cover some of their costs, such as accommodation on campus, meals and enrolment fees.		Around sixty universities worldwide participate in the ISEP Direct program. Under this program, students pay the full registration and tuition fees.	
Unifr conditions	<ul style="list-style-type: none">You must have paid your registration fee and be enrolled at Unifr. * **You must have obtained at least 60 ECTS credits by the time your mobility placement starts and fulfil the conditions of your faculty.You must have the consent of your mobility coordinator/academic advisor.You must have sufficient language skills. Please refer to the host universities' terms and conditions.Please note that ISEP requires you to have a TOEFL certificate to optimise your eligibility for as many English-speaking universities as possible. Make sure you have this certificate by the end of January or mid-August.You must meet the specific requirements of the ISEP universities (choose 'More filters' and tick 'ISEP Exchange' or 'ISEP Direct').

ISEP selection	The number of places is limited. You cannot be certain that you will be selected for your first-choice university. Select seven to ten universities and ISEP will allocate you a place according to the number of places available and your academic requirements. Further information about the chances of placement .		If you meet the academic requirements and are selected by the International Relations Office, there is an excellent chance that you will be placed at your chosen university.

Application to Unifr	<ol style="list-style-type: none">1. Visit the ISEP website and use the ISEP search engine to find partner universities that offer courses in your field of study.2. Browse the courses on offer at partner universities on their website. Ensure that they are comparable to those at Fribourg.3. Go to the “Mobility – Outgoing” tab on the MyUnifr portal to find out about the different steps you need to take before submitting a mobility application.4. Collect all the requested documents and complete the online mobility application form.5. Get your academic advisor to sign the application and upload it to your MyUnifr portal .6. The IRO will check your application.

ISEP application	<p>If you have been selected for the ISEP program, the IRO will send you instructions about your ISEP application.</p> <ol style="list-style-type: none">1. Create an account on the ISEP website to begin your online ISEP application.2. Once the ISEP coordinator at Unifr has approved your request to start an application, you can submit your application online (see deadlines above).3. After submitting your application on the ISEP site, the IRO will check it and validate it, if it is complete.4. ISEP will email you instructions on the steps to follow. Mobility costs and subsidy	<ol style="list-style-type: none">1. ISEP registration fee: USD 100 payable to ISEP at registration – non-refundable fee.2. ISEP placement fee: USD 450 payable to ISEP upon placement at a university - non-refundable fee. These taxes (registration and placement) will not be refunded in case of cancellation. Further information on ISEP fees You must take out obligatory ISEP health insurance before your departure. Allow for around USD 100 per month. Plan your budget3. Contribution to the ISEP program: Billed costs per semester: CHF 3,500.-. The actual cost ranges between CHF 9,000.- to CHF 12'000.- but you will receive a Unifr subsidy, the amount of which is calculated every year. These costs will be billed to you before your departure and include accommodation on the university campus, meals, and info-sessions, etc. Click here for further information on the ISEP website <div>University costs depend on the individual ISEP university and must be paid in full by the student (there is no subsidy from Unifr).
