Guidelines for Authors



General

1. Contributions will be considered and accepted for publication on the understanding that they are final, unpublished, not submitted for publication in any other journal and are written by the author.
2. All contributed work should be written in English. Quotes in other languages may appear in the main body of the contribution provided an accurate translation is also given.
3. Contributed work should be submitted in electronic format (MS Word or similar word processing software application is accepted). Please send your contribution to the email address: gar-icc@qmul.ac.uk
4. The author(s) should claim responsibility for the material submitted and sign a declaration that the work submitted is the author's own work, which has not been previously published.
5. Following the guidelines avoids delays and facilitates in the assessment of the work submitted for consideration.

Style

1. All contributed work of the authors, including dissertations and shorter essays produced during the author's academic studies, should be adapted to an article format before being submitted for consideration.
 2. Contributions should be written in *Times New Roman* with font size **12**.
 3. Long articles should not exceed a 15,000-word limit (including footnotes). An abstract of 150 words maximum and three keywords should be included at the beginning of the article in **bold** and *italic* type.
 4. Short articles must be no more than 5,000 words in length (including footnotes).
 5. Case notes should ideally be 1,500-2,000 words in length.
 6. Book reviews should ideally be 1,500-2,000 words in length.
 7. The levels of headings should not be more than four in number.
 8. Numbering of the pages should be on the top right hand of the page.
 9. Citations should follow the OSCOLA referencing guidelines. For example:
 - Articles should be cited as follows:
Author's name; title of the Article in single quotation marks; year of publication in brackets; volume; journal's full title; page.
 - Books should be cited as follows:
Author's name (if an edited book then the name of the editor(s) should appear in brackets followed by 'ed(s).'); title of book in italics; edition; place of publication; year; chapter or pages.

10. Footnotes should appear on the bottom of the page and should be numbered consecutively.
 11. Quotations, references, footnotes and other sources should be verified before submission. The *Review* will not be responsible for their accuracy.
 12. One type of spelling (English UK) should be used throughout the continued work.
 13. Contributed work with spelling or grammatical errors will be returned to the author(s) for correction.
